<p>English</p>	<p>Create a fact file about yourself and call it 'All About Me'. You can do this in your book or using a computer/laptop.</p> 	<p>Go on a family walk. Draw/take a picture and write about what you could See/Hear/Smell/Feel.</p> 	<p>Help prepare some vegetables for a family dinner. Draw and label the vegetables you prepared and tell us what you found easy/difficult.</p> 	<p>Order some items in alphabetical order. Find some items in your kitchen and order them alphabetically. You can take a picture or draw and label them in your book.</p>
<p>Maths</p>	<p>Bake a cake! Help your adult weigh out the ingredients. List your ingredients and write out the instructions on how to make the cake. You can also take a picture!</p> 	<p>Go on a hunt around your house for objects that are different 2D and 3D shapes. You can draw these in your book or take a picture, labelling the shape you find.</p>	<p>Find some conkers. Count how many conkers you find and play a game with them. You could take some pictures of you playing the game.</p> 	<p>Create your own board game. Create a game of your choice that involves counting, adding, subtracting or ordering numbers. Take pictures or send it in with your homework book.</p>
<p>Science</p>	<p>Can you label the different parts of your body? You can draw/take a picture of yourself. How many body parts can you name?</p>	<p>Hunt for bugs. Draw the bugs you have found and label their different body parts.</p> 	<p>Create a poster on a chosen animal. Can you write some interesting facts about the animal that you have researched?</p>	<p>Create your own seasonal picture. You can be as creative and imaginative as you want choosing your own equipment and materials you want to use.</p> 
<p>Topic</p>	<p>Explore your local area. Go for a walk within your local area and create a map of where you have been.</p> 	<p>Help a Parent/Carer to wash the pots! Help out in the house by rolling your sleeves up and cleaning some pots. You can take a picture!</p> 	<p>Can you research toys from the past? What is different about toys then and now? You can draw and label a picture of an old toy and a new toy and explain how they are different.</p>	<p>Go to your local park and collect some sticks! Make a picture on the floor with the sticks. You can take a photo or glue them in your book, writing your own imaginative title for your artwork.</p> 
<p>Creative Arts</p>	<p>Create a portrait of your family or a family member. You can use paint, felt tip pens, colouring pencils, or just a pencil.</p>	<p>Design a pumpkin face. Draw a round pumpkin shape, design the cut-out face shapes and colour it in.</p> 	<p>Create a firework picture. Around the picture, use adjectives to describe the sound and look of the fireworks.</p>	<p>Make leaf rubbings. Use a pencil or crayon to rub over a few leaves in your book.</p>
