


Homework Challenge: Year 2

Autumn – Giants (Ireland, BFG, Iron Man) and Fire, Fire

English	<p>BOOK HUNT</p> <p>Can you find another book, either at home or at the library, that has a giant in it? Draw the front cover and write a book review.</p>	<p>Giant Land</p> <p>Design your own giant land – make it as detailed as you can. Could you have giant buildings/vehicles? Label your design.</p>	<p>Bonfire Poem</p> <p>Write a poem about a bonfire/firework. This could be presented as creatively as you like!</p> 	<p>Research Guy Fawkes</p> <p>Could you make a fact file about Guy Fawkes? This may include facts and pictures</p> 
Maths and Problem Solving	<p>Create a board game</p> <p>Create a game of your choice, with the theme: Giants! It must involve counting, adding, subtracting or ordering numbers. Take pictures or send it in with your homework book.</p>	<p>Create a 3D Giant</p> <p>Collect recyclable objects to create a 3D Giant. Draw/stick in a photo and label your giant in your book...can you tell me what some of the 3D shapes are?</p>	<p>Giant's Timetable</p> <p>Giants aren't as clever as humans! Create an hour-by-hour timetable for a Giant – making sure you write or draw the time and thinking of what they could do at each hour. Could they be getting out of bed? Or going to a 'human eating' class?</p>	<p>THE GREAT FIRE OF LONDON</p> <p>Write this heading out in your book. How many words can you find within this heading? For example: rat, tear, hedge</p> 
Science	<p>Iron Man – Menu</p> <p>Iron Man only likes to eat metal. How many metal objects around your house can you find? Present this a menu for Iron Man, with at least 3 courses.</p>	<p>Question Time</p> <p>In science, it's important to ask questions! Make a list of questions you would ask the BFG or Iron Man. Remember, to start your questions in different ways.</p>  <p>You could then roll play these questions with someone else in your house. You could be the Giant and they could ask you the questions.</p>	<p>Fire Experiment (ADULT MUST BE PRESENT)</p> <p>When you freeze water – it turns into a solid. You can then, put it in a pan with fire underneath, and it will melt into a liquid. Carry out an experiment like this, using other materials in your kitchen. For example, butter or chocolate. Present your findings in picture form or writing a summary.</p>	<p>House Materials</p> <p>In 1666, houses <u>weren't</u> made out of bricks. Can you research what they were made out of? Can you now think about why the fire spread so quickly in London? Write a few sentences to summarise your findings.</p>
Topic	<p>FLAGS</p> <p>We will learn the Irish Flag. Can you research other flags and draw and label them?</p> 	<p>Lucky Clover</p> <p>Go on a walk. Hunt for a Lucky Four Leaf Clover. If you find one – bring it in. Write a recount of your trip – telling me where you looked.</p> 	<p>Mini-Gymnast</p> <p>Create a gymnastics routine involving balancing and rolling. Could this be a group routine involving people at home? Write instructions using pictures to show me your masterpiece.</p>	<p>Secret Helper</p> <p>This weekend do 5 things (at least!) to help someone at home...but don't tell them! List what you have done and how you felt.</p>
Creative Arts	<p>Dream Catcher</p> <p>Can you create a 'Dream Catcher', like the one in the BFG OR like one in the picture? Go on a walk in your local area, can you catch any dreams?</p> 	<p>Iron Man</p> <p>Use tinfoil to create a picture of Iron Man.</p> 	<p>Firework Fun!</p> <p>Use any material that you want to create a firework picture. Who can be the most creative?</p>	<p>Great Fire of London – Jar</p> <p>Find an empty jar (like a jam jar) and clean it out. Make a silhouette of the city inside and add fire coloured tissue paper to go above. Bring these in to show everyone!</p>
