



Whitehouse Primary School Remote Learning Strategy

When will my child need to learn from home?

- If your child has to self-isolate because of coronavirus
- If the school has to close a class grouping or if the school has to close
- If your child has to shield

What is my child expected to do?

All children are expected to engage in their learning in order to continue to make good progress during these challenging times of Covid-19

- Children should attend lessons in a shared/communal space or room with an open door and/or when appropriately supervised by a parent/carer or another appropriate adult
- Children and/or parents/carers should not forward or share access links.

What support will school give?

Each year group will email a two week learning block of work including a weekly timetable of work to support pupil's working from home.

Regular contact with the teacher via email/telephone contact/video meeting in order to support children's learning.

Regular feedback

What can I do to help my child?

- Distinguish between weekdays and the weekend to maintain the separation between school and home
- Designate a working space if possible
- As much as possible, keep to your usual routines – i.e. get up and have breakfast as usual, get dressed before starting the school work
- Follow the timings on the timetable provided by school to create structure and to ensure everyone knows what they should be doing and when
- Ensure your child has a break and some time for exercise to keep your child active

Class, or school has to remain at home due to an outbreak of COVID-19 or a national lockdown.	An individual pupil has to isolate due to having the COVID19 virus themselves or their family isolating.
<p>Class teacher will provide by email weekly timetable of activities</p> <p style="text-align: center;">↓</p> <p>Work pack to be provided with activities as per timetable</p> <p style="text-align: center;">↓</p> <p>Every child to be offered at least 3 online video sessions (via Zoom) per week</p> <p style="text-align: center;">↓</p> <p>Video sessions to last for no more than 45 minutes – target whole/half class or smaller groups (they will never be offered to individual children)</p> <p style="text-align: center;">↓</p> <p>The sessions will give teaching input to help the children tackle the work set for them by covering key concepts</p> <p style="text-align: center;">↓</p> <p>Online sessions will be scheduled at different times enabling households with only 1 device to access</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Please see timetable for possible teaching sessions</p>	<p>Class teacher will provide by email weekly timetable of activities</p> <p style="text-align: center;">↓</p> <p>Work pack to be provided that follows the class learning with activities as per timetable</p> <p style="text-align: center;">↓</p> <p>Work to be completed if the child is well-enough to do so</p> <p style="text-align: center;">↓</p> <p>Work requiring marking to be submitted via email for teacher to assess at the end of each day (timetable to identify work that requires submitting)</p> <p style="text-align: center;">↓</p> <p>Class teacher to give feedback on work via email</p> <p style="text-align: center;">↓</p> <p>Further work set until the child returns to school</p>

Parental expectations:

- To ensure that your child engages with, and completes the work set
- To submit evidence of completed work via email as required via e.g. photographs, word documents, scanned work etc.
- Share the feedback given by the class teacher with the child
- Ensure that your child takes part in online sessions where they can
- Support your child with regular reading either with you or reading independently or using directed reading activities from their teacher
- Optional (additional to what has been planned and sent from your teacher) – Complete work from other sources e.g. The Oak Academy, BBC bitesize, textbooks and workbooks that have been sent home.
